AN ACT MAKING ADJUSTMENTS TO THE BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2017.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Sec. 9. (*Effective July 1, 2016*) Notwithstanding subsection (g) of
2 section 4-89 of the general statutes, up to \$200,000 of the unexpended
3 balance of the amount appropriated to the Department of
4 Rehabilitation Services, for Part-Time Interpreters, including the
5 amount appropriated in section 1 of public act 15-244, as amended by
6 section 155 of public act 15-5 of the June special session, shall not lapse
7 on June 30, 2016, and such amount shall be carried forward and
8 transferred to Personal Services, and shall be available for such
9 purpose for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2017.

10 Sec. 10. (*Effective July 1, 2016*) For the fiscal year ending June 30,
11 2017, the Commissioner of Public Health shall reduce on a pro rata
12 basis payments to full-time municipal health departments, pursuant to
13 section 19a-202 of the general statutes, and to health districts, pursuant
14 to section 19a-245 of the general statutes, in an aggregate amount equal

15 to \$310,636.

16 Sec. 11. (*Effective July 1, 2016*) On or before January 15, 2017, the
17 Commissioner of Public Health shall submit a report, in accordance
18 with the provisions of section 11-4a of the general statutes, to the joint
19 standing committees of the General Assembly having cognizance of
20 matters relating to appropriations and the budgets of state agencies,
21 public health, and finance, revenue and bonding, and to the Secretary
22 of the Office of Policy and Management, concerning the expenditures
23 necessary to ensure the continued administration of safe drinking
24 water standards for public drinking water. Such report shall include,
25 but not be limited to: (1) A projection of the costs of administering safe
26 drinking water standards for public drinking water for the fiscal years
27 ending June 30, 2018, to June 30, 2022, inclusive, (2) a projection of
28 available state and federal funds to support the Department of Public
29 Health's efforts to keep drinking water safe, and (3) recommendations
30 regarding fees or other means of sustaining said department's efforts
31 to keep public drinking water safe. The report shall be developed in
32 consultation with the Water Planning Council established pursuant to
33 section 25-33o of the general statutes.

34 Sec. 12. Section 39 of public act 15-244 is repealed and the following
35 is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July 1, 2016*):

36 (a) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 4-28e of the general
37 statutes, as amended by [this act] public act 15-244, for the fiscal [years]
38 year ending June 30, 2016, [and June 30, 2017,] the sum of \$550,000 [in
39 each fiscal year] shall be transferred from the Tobacco and Health
40 Trust Fund to the Department of Public Health, for (1) grants for the
41 Easy Breathing Program, as follows: (A) For an adult asthma program
42 within the Easy Breathing Program - \$150,000, and (B) for a children's
43 asthma program within the Easy Breathing Program - \$250,000; and (2)
44 a grant to the Connecticut Coalition for Environmental Justice for the
45 Asthma Outreach and Education Program - \$150,000.

46 (b) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 4-28e of the general
47 statutes, as amended by [this act] public act 15-244, the sum of \$750,000
48 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016, [and the sum of \$750,000 for
49 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2017,] shall be transferred from the
50 Tobacco and Health Trust Fund to the Department of Developmental
51 Services to implement recommendations resulting from a study
52 conducted pursuant to section 27 of public act 11-6 to enhance and
53 improve the services and supports for individuals with autism and
54 their families.

55 Sec. 13. (*Effective July 1, 2016*) (a) Notwithstanding the provisions of
56 subsection (c) of section 4-28e of the general statutes, the sum of
57 \$700,000 shall be transferred from the Tobacco and Health Trust Fund
58 and credited to the resources of the General Fund for the fiscal year
59 ending June 30, 2017.

60 (b) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 4-28e of the general
61 statutes, the sum of \$750,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2017,
62 shall be transferred from the Tobacco and Health Trust Fund to the
63 Department of Social Services to implement recommendations
64 resulting from a study conducted pursuant to section 27 of public act
65 11-6 to enhance and improve the services and supports for individuals
66 with autism and their families.

67 Sec. 14. (*Effective July 1, 2016*) Notwithstanding subsection (c) of
68 section 10-262h of the general statutes, the amounts for equalization
69 aid for the fiscal year June 30, 2017, are as follows:
